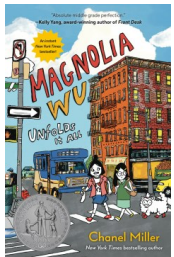

Magnolia Wu and Iris, a new friend from California, set off across New York City to solve the mystery of each missing sock, meeting people and uncovering the unimaginable along the way.

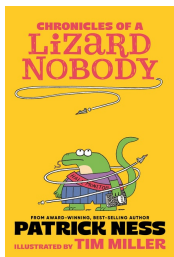


The Long Way Around

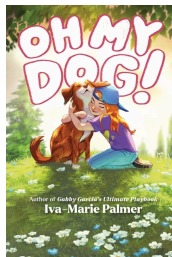


Chronicles of a Lizard Nobody

Ellie's plan to rescue her brother from the clutches of their new neighbor backfires spectacularly. She must find a way to win back her brother and save her beloved tree.

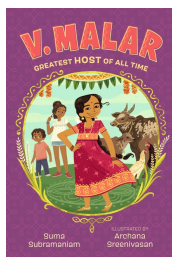

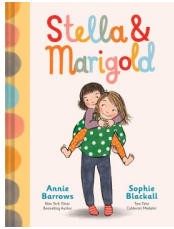

Told in alternating voices, Miguel and his newly adopted, street-savvy cat, Lolo, build a loving and supportive friendship in Washington Heights.

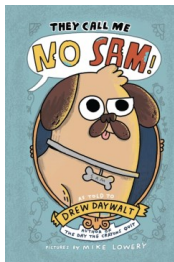


The Wishkeeper's Apprentice

Felix meets a strange old man who is a Wishkeeper and becomes his apprentice to help stop a threat to every wish ever granted in Whittlestone.

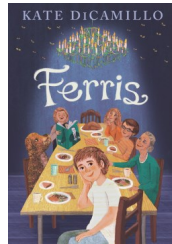


They Call Me No Sam!

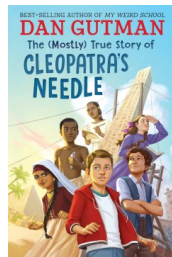


Johnny, the Sea, and Me
