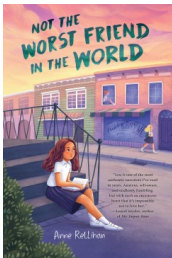


The Last Dragon on Mars

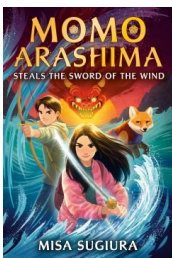


Not the Worst Friend in the World

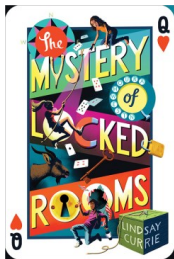
The Night War

During World War II, 12-year old Miriam secretly spirits other Jewish people out of Nazi-occupied France after being separated from her family and forced into hiding.



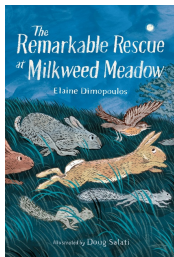
The Tenth Mistake of Hank Hooperman

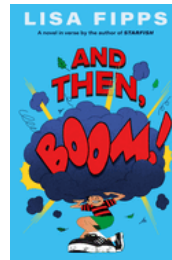
The Mystery of Locked Rooms

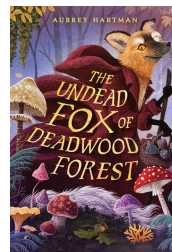

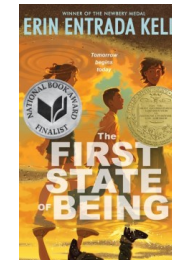

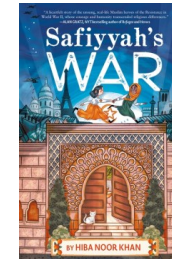
The Undead Fox of Deadwood Forest
