We ask that you limit your bathroom visits to one student at a time. Independence is a good skill to have.



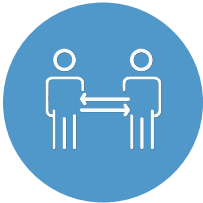

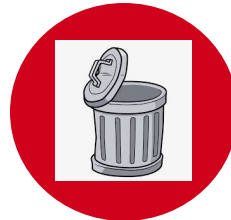
Have any questions, thoughts or feedback for us? We'd love to hear it!
