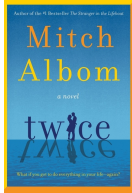

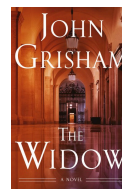

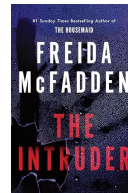

by Louise Penny

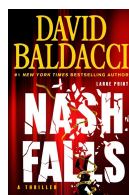

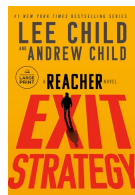
Remain: A Supernatural Love Story

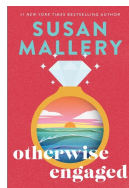
Nash Falls

A twisty, tender and wise look at how secrets can transform the powerful—and sometimes problematic—bond between mothers and daughters. (11/4)



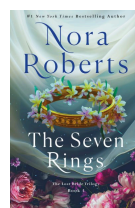
False Witness
