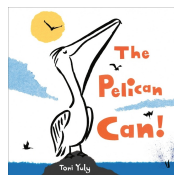


### See This Little Dot

Lively text and bold illustrations tell the story of a young pelican who wakes up hungry and its parents who know just what to do.



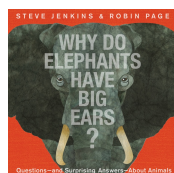
### Crane Jane!

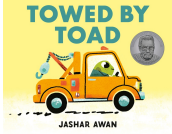

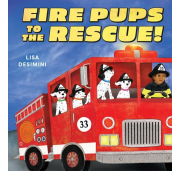


### Towed by Toad

Toad, who's always on the move to help others, learns everyone needs help sometimes—even him.

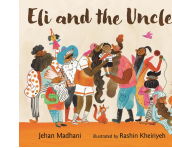


### Fire Pups to the Rescue!

Pop! As a hot day sizzles into evening, everyone on stoops and sidewalks looks skyward on this special summer night—the Fourth of July!

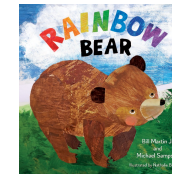


### It's Corn Picking Time!

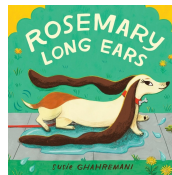


### Hen in the Bed

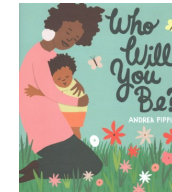


### Rosemary Long Ears

A spirited dog with extraordinary ears creates mayhem and memories with her young human friend.

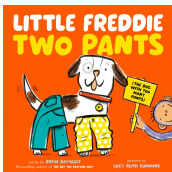


### Who Will You Be?
