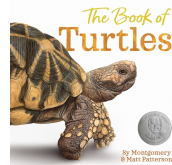

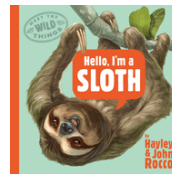


The Book of Turtles
