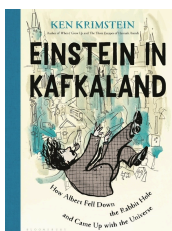

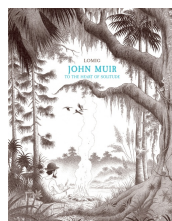

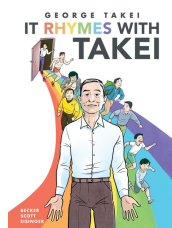


It Rhymes With Takei

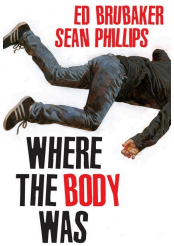

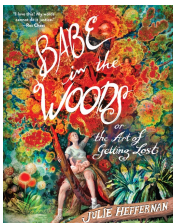

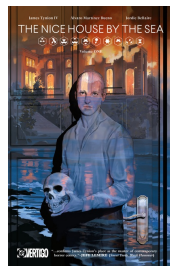
