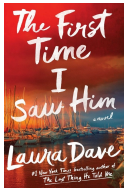

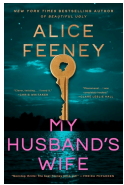

by Laura Dave

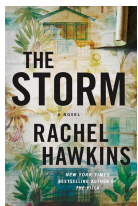

by Rachel Hawkins

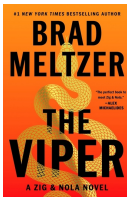

by James Lee Burke

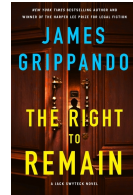

by Robert Dugoni

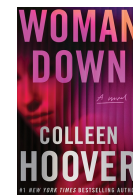

by Steve Berry

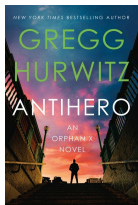

by Mary Kubica

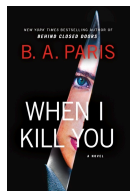

by Jo Nesbo

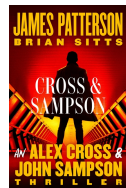
A serial killer, a suspended police officer and a self-proclaimed crime writer collide in a chilling exploration of the murderer's mind. (2/3)

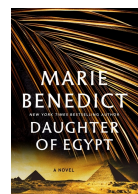
Have you ever wished you could live inside a book? Welcome to the Astral Library, where books are not just objects, but doors to new worlds, new lives, and new futures. (2/17)

by Elizabeth Berg

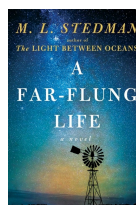
