by V. E. Schwab



by Jesse Lonergan



by R. F. Kuang



by Joe Abercrombie






Legalist

A young witch teaches her mother how to do magic -- with very unexpected results -- in this relatable, resonant novel about family, identity, and the power of love.




Onyx Storm


To Clutch a Razor


Mate


The Raven Scholar


A Ruin, Great and Free
