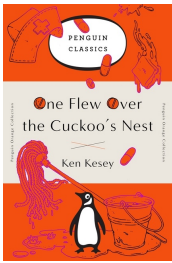


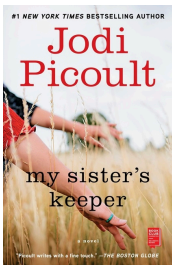

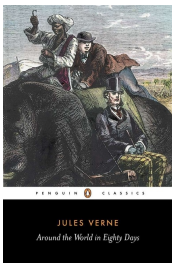
One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest

My Sister's Keeper

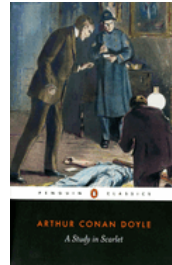
