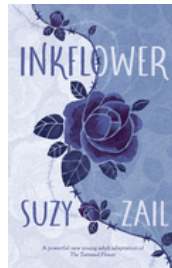


Everything We Never Had

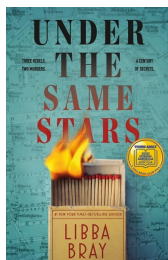

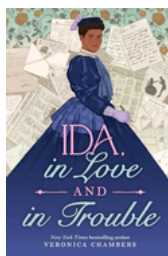
